50% Native kids live below poverty line


NA postneonatal mortality rate 7.4/1000 (highest of all groups in the USA)



Indian Health Service

- Treaty-stipulated obligation to many tribes
- Reorganized under U.S. Public Health Program, 1954
- Quality of care
- Privacy
- Sterilization: 25,000 tubal ligations by 1975 without consent







All 3 can see the game without supports or accommodations because the cause(s) of the inequity was addressed. The systemic barrier has been removed.


Healing & Reconciliation

- The solution to hurting is not pain relief; it's healing.




ARBINGER Pyramid of Influence™
